Workers who have a specific remit to respond to people know to be affected by trauma AND are required to provide advocacy support or interventions OR are required to adapt the way they work to take into account trauma reactions to do their job well and reduce risk of retraumatisation

Workers who are likely to be coming into contact with people who may have been affected by trauma.





Workers who have a specific remit to provide specialist interventions or therapies for people known to be affected by trauma with complex needs





 Trauma Informed Justice: A Knowledge and Skills Framework for working with Victims and Witnesses (NHS Education for Scotland)
